The clause(s) listed below are in addition to the General Academic Regulations.

To comply with professional and PSRB expectations the progression regulations for the MSc Advanced Clinical Practice vary from the University regulations in that students may take referral assignments in up to 90 ECTS (180 CATS).

Continuation on your programme is subject to consideration of any criminal convictions. The programme is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act [1986].
